Business owners in Hennepin County are currently navigating complex requirements like Minnesota Paid Leave, I-9 compliance, responding to audits, and enforcement actions. These situations can feel overwhelming, but business owners don't have to face them alone.

Business owner rights and information

- Small businesses and other places of employment may encounter specific actions to be aware of and prepared for:
 - I-9 inspections, also called I-9 audits, are an administrative inspection process conducted by the Department of Homeland Security (DHS). During this process, a DHS agent will request specific business records to confirm that the business's employees have appropriate work authorization. More on I-9 Inspections
 - Officials from the Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) may come to a business with a warrant to locate or detain specific individuals or search a location. The National Immigration Law Center (NILC) offers a helpful guide for steps that employers can take if immigration officials come to your workplace. <u>NILC Guide for Employers</u>
